Maxwell and Turchan Named SUNYAC MVPs

Senior Rob Maxwell (Amherst, NY/Sweet Home) and junior Courtney Turchan (Smithtown, NY/Smithtown) were each voted the best player in the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) for Baseball and Softball respectively.

Maxwell finished the regular season with a .439 batting average in conference games with a team-leading five doubles and one home run. He also led the team with 15 runs batted in and a .634 slugging average. The senior split time as the first baseman and a starting pitcher and had a 2-1 SUNYAC record with a 2.95 ERA and a team-leading 20 strikeouts in 21 1/3 innings.

Turchan led the conference with a .507 batting average and hits with 38. She was tied for first in the conference with 11 doubles and 54 total bases and finished second with 22 runs scored. Additionally, Turchan was selected as a First-Team honoree to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association) NFCA All-Region team.

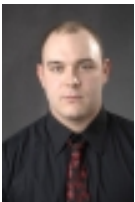


Women's

Amanda Elias (Belmont, NY/Genesee Valley) is this week's female athlete of the week after setting three new school records at the New York State Championships over the weekend at Rochester.

The freshman won the 800-meter run in a school record of 2:14.65, which is also an NCAA provisional qualifying time. She ran the final leg of the 4x400 relay team where the Golden Eagles won first place with an NCAA provisional time of 3:54.06.

Elias also ran the final leg of the 4x800-meter relay team that set another school record with a time of 9:30.82, as the women's outdoor track and field team won the New York State Championship for the first time ever.



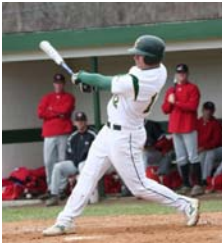
Men's

Josh Dupuis (Tupper Lake, NY/Tupper Lake) is this week's male athlete of the week for the second consecutive week after winning two more events and setting a new school record over the weekend at the New York State Championships in Rochester.

The senior thrower won both the shot put and the discus events at the New York State

Championship and led the Golden Eagles to a New York State Championships. His throw of 16.42 meters or 53'10" is a new Brockport school record and improved his NCAA provisional qualifying distance, while winning the shot put.

Dupuis also won the discus event with an NCAA provisional qualifying distance of 47.60 meters (156'2") at the State Championships. His throw was over four meters ahead of the next closest competitor.



Baseball Earns No. 3 Seed in ECAC Tournament

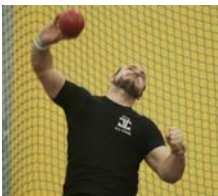
Golden Eagles finish second in the SUNYAC Tournament

Senior Rob Maxwell (Amherst, NY/Sweet Home) and sophomore Joe LaDuca (North Tonawanda, NY/North Tonawanda) had two hits each to lead the offense for The College at Brockport Baseball team but SUNY Cortland pounded out 16 hits and scored a 12-5 victory in the championship round of the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) Tournament Sunday in Cortland. The victory gave the Red Dragons their fourth straight SUNYAC title and Brockport finishes second for the third time in the last six seasons. Brockport defeated Plattsburgh 12-0 and Oneonta 10-7 to advance to the championship game against Cortland.
