Common Threads is a COSAC-sponsored knitting and crochet group created for the purpose of enjoying each other's company as we work together to create charity projects for those in need. Keeping in mind that participants would be at all levels of experience and in the spirit of *Warm Up America*, we chose an afghan as our first project. Afghanes will be created with sections of 7"x9" squares that have been knitted or crocheted and then joined together. Our first creations will be given to the Lakeside Beikirch Care Center at Lakeside Hospital in Brockport. COSAC has donated yarn, knitting nee-

dles and crochet hooks, which are limited to participants working with us on the charity projects. Anyone interested in joining us who would prefer to knit or crochet personal projects using their own supplies are most welcome as well. The group has been getting together every other week during the summer.

What an amazing experience this has been! Everyone's generous donations of time, effort and additional yarn has been overwhelming and we're thrilled to have over 115 squares made so far (and even a beautiful handmade quilt donated by Dori Widger's mom!).

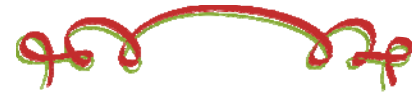

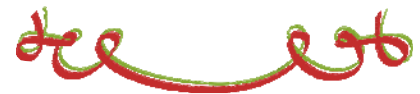

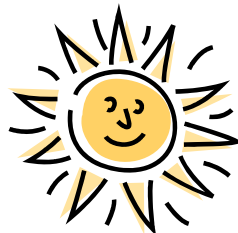

RECIPE—Hot Mulled Cider

1/2 cup brown sugar
2 quarts pasteurized cider
1 tsp whole allspice
1-1/2 tsp whole cloves
2 sticks cinnamon
Orange slices

Put all ingredients in a crock pot. If desired, tie whole spices in cheesecloth or put in a tea strainer (if spices are added loose, strain before serving). Cover and cook on low 2-8 hrs.
