Student Conduct Board**Residential Life/Learning Communities**

The Administrative Conduct Board is responsible for hearing cases of potential violations of Brockport's Code of Student Conduct. Each Administrative Conduct Board consists of at least three thoroughly trained members drawn from the pool of eligible faculty, staff and student board members. Upon review of a case, the board makes a determination as to whether or not a policy violation has occurred and recommends sanctions to the Student Conduct Coordinator. Sanctions range from an Official Warning up to and including Dismissal from the University. Undergraduate and graduate students in good academic and judicial standing with the University are eligible to apply. Applicants must abide by the Code of Student Conduct. Other requirements include: Knowledge of the Code of Student Conduct, strong communication and interpersonal skills, effective problem solving and critical thinking skills, the ability to work effectively with others, sensitivity to and respect for others, openness to differences, a strong sense of impartiality and objectivity and the ability to maintain strict confidentiality of all conduct information. This is a volunteer position with a time commitment of approximately 4-10 hours a month.
