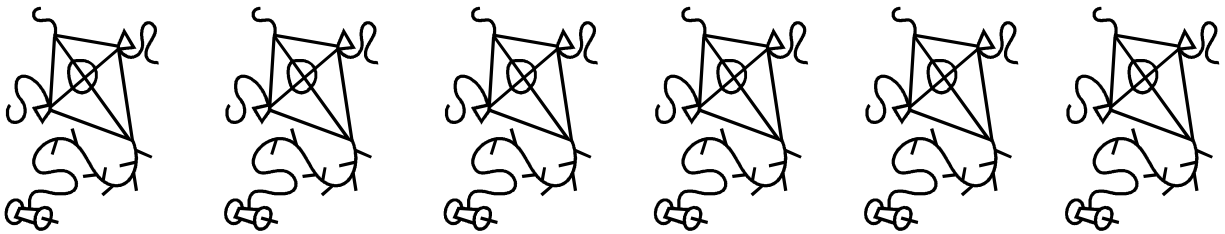

**LST 708.61 LOVE IN THE WESTERN WORLD**

Mondays            6 – 9:15 pm            MetroCenter

This course will examine the philosophy of love in the West, examining classical theories of *eros*, *agape* and *philia*. Then students will read representative literary works and analyze how love functions in literature and reflects on the gaps and omissions of classical theory. Students will also be required to give oral presentations on classic philosophical and scientific theories, as well as non-Western texts, which will throw additional light on the classical perspectives.

**LST 726.61 SOCIAL ROLE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (3607)**

Science and technology continue to transform our world. Science has always been intimately related to society. The new capabilities and understanding from science and technology continue to mesh with the goals and needs of our society. This course will discuss ways society and science have affected each other. It will introduce a historical perspective of this relation for the past several decades, including the contemporary society. The course will also identify trends and changes within science and technology in relation to the larger society. Students will attend lectures, discuss issues, and write essays.

**LST 748.61 INCLUDING VIOLENCE PREVENTION IN THE ACADEMIC CURRICULUM (4283)**

This course covers an overview of social and emotional development in children and adolescents and how this work contributes to knowledge of violence prevention in the schools. The course will allow students to begin to learn how to incorporate state-of-the-art violence prevention techniques in their lesson plans without compromising the quality of the teaching or the material.

**LST 797.01 PROJECT PORTFOLIO (3311)**

### IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- **PRIOR WRITTEN APPROVAL IS REQUIRED** for any changes you wish to make to your Plan of Study. To obtain a Course Substitution Request Form, contact the program secretary at [cgiblin@brockport.edu](mailto:cgiblin@brockport.edu).
- You may update e-mail, address, or phone number information through Banner. Name changes must be done directly through the Registrar's Office. If you have not yet notified us of these changes, please do so at your earliest convenience.
- **Continuous Enrollment** requires the completion of at least one graduate-level course every 12 months. Unless granted a leave of absence, students will lose matriculation status and must reapply for readmission to the program.\*
- **Degree completion time limit** – Requirements need to be completed within five years of the date of matriculation. If an extension is granted and requirements are not completed by the end of the extension, students will lose matriculation status and must reapply for readmission to the program.\*

\* Students will need to meet any new requirements for admission and the degree AND will lose credit for courses taken more than five years prior to the new matriculation date.
