*The **Brockport Global Village** is open to first year students who may have experience with or an interest in international travel, foreign languages, study abroad, cultural food and activities, or has a willingness to try new things. Students in the Brockport Global Village may have an opportunity to live among international students.*

*The **Civic Engagement and Service Learning Community** is open to first year students with an interest community service projects created by the learning community itself. Students will become problem solvers and learn active citizenship by working with each other, faculty and staff on various service projects. All students in this community will take courses together, including PLS 392, Topics in American Politics (fall) and PLS 395, Perspectives on American Democracy (spring).*

*The **Health and Fitness Learning Community** is for first year students with an interest in exploring/pursuing health-related careers through personal development, career exploration, peer education/advocacy, and campus/community engagement. Freshmen in this community will get involved with health issues early in their first semester and will help them acquire understanding of their academic program.*

*The **Math and Science Learning Community** is for first year students planning to major in math- and science-related disciplines wishing to participate in academic and co-curricular opportunities designed to enhance understanding of their chosen field of study. Open to any first year students planning to major in biological sciences, chemistry, earth and environmental sciences, computational science, computer science, computer information systems, biology, geology, mathematics, meteorology, physics, or water resources.*
